MEETING GUIDELINES

Meetings of the Board of Zoning Appels (BZA) are open to the public, and residents are encouraged to attend and/or submit written comments. In an effort to foster an orderly and constructive meeting process, we ask the public to kindly observe the following rules and guidelines.

RULES & GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

The public is allowed to speak only during the Open Portion of the Hearing, or at such time as the presiding officer of the Board shall allow.

Speakers must be recognized by the presiding officer.

The Town requests that speakers state, for the meeting minutes, their name, address and organization (if any).

Speakers shall limit their remarks to matters directly related to the variance request at hand.

All remarks shall be addressed to the Board as a body, and not to individual public officials.

Debate with other members of the public is not permitted.

Discourse or cross-talk among other members of the public can only occur with permission of the presiding officer.

Speakers shall observe the commonly accepted rules of respectful discourse and civility.
