MEETING GUIDELINES

Meetings of the Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee (CPSC) are open to the public, and residents are encouraged to attend. To foster an orderly and constructive meeting process, we ask the public to kindly observe the following rules and guidelines.

RULES & GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

The public is allowed to speak only during the Privilege of the Floor or at such times as the presiding officer or a majority of the Committee shall allow. During the time noted on the agenda as 'Privilege of the Floor', the attending public is invited to offer verbal comment relative to items of CPSC concern not on the agenda.

Speakers must be recognized by the presiding officer.

The Town requests that all speakers state, for the meeting minutes, their name, address and organization (if any).

Speakers shall limit their remarks to 3 minutes on a given topic.

Speakers may not yield any remaining time they may have to another speaker. Committee members may, with the permission of the presiding officer, interrupt a speaker during their remarks, but only for the purpose of clarification or information.

All remarks shall be addressed to the Committee as a body, and not to individual public officials or in debate with other members of the public.

Speakers shall observe the commonly accepted rules of respectful discourse and civility.
