MEETING GUIDELINES

Meetings of the Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee (CPSC) are open to the public, and residents are encouraged to attend. In an effort to foster an orderly and constructive meeting process, we ask the public to kindly observe the following rules and guidelines.

RULES & GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

During the time noted on the Agenda as Privilege of the Floor, the attending public is invited to offer verbal comment relative to the given Agenda (or other items of CPSC concern). Such privilege is commonly limited to 3 minutes or as determined by the presiding officer or majority vote of the Committee.

The public is allowed to speak only during the Privilege of the Floor or at such time as the presiding officer or a majority of the Committee shall allow.

The Town requests that speakers state, for the meeting minutes, their name, address and organization (if any).

Speakers must be recognized by the presiding officer.

Speakers shall limit their remarks to 3 minutes on a given topic.

Speakers may not yield any remaining time they may have to another speaker. Committee members may, with the permission of the presiding officer, interrupt a speaker during their remarks, but only for the purpose of clarification or information.

All remarks shall be addressed to the Committee as a body, and not to individual public officials or in debate with other members of the public.

Speakers shall observe the commonly accepted rules of respectful discourse and civility.
